Diploma in Foundations Programmes 基礎文憑課程



The one-year Diploma in Foundations programmes in Cantonese Opera, Dance, Drama, Music, and Theatre and Entertainment Arts are structured to impart a broad understanding of and develop skills in the students' chosen subject in preparation for their career in performing arts/ technical arts or further studies at undergraduate level at the Academy.

These programmes target students who have artistic talents and achieved "22222" results (including Chinese and English languages) or higher in HKDSE. Upon completing these programmes with satisfactory academic results, students will be eligible for direct entry into the Bachelor's Degree programmes of the Academy.



For students who are interested in pursuing a career in performing arts, the Student Recruitment and Community Engagement Office of The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts (HKAPA) has specially organised a series of online expert and school talks presented by arts professionals and alumni of the Academy to share the latest trends in the industry as well as the development of the Schools of HKAPA. Talks in 6 subject areas of performing arts (Chinese Opera, Dance, Drama, Film and Television, Music, and Theatre and Entertainment Arts) are available in-person and online on demand and are free of charge.

We are pleased to announce that two students from the Schools of Drama and Music respectively are awarded in the 2nd round of the Creative Project Fund selection. They will receive a total of HK\$90,000 for their projects to promote arts inclusion. Michelle Lo from the School of Drama will lead an interdisciplinary art project of theatre, painting and photography, "Me Amo," to promote self-embrace and appreciation in the community of people with disabilities and Leo Cheng from the School of Music will create a multimedia performance called "City and You" to help people with anxiety to relieve their emotions, and to raise public awareness of anxiety.

The Creative Project Fund is provided for HKAPA students to develop creative projects which are able to fulfill the mission of "Arts for Everyone" and promote inclusiveness through the arts to build a caring society. The 3rd and the 4th round of projects will be carried out in Year 2022-2024.
