Hong Kong has a vibrant and active cultural and arts landscape. Non-local graduates of our Undergraduate Programmes will be eligible to apply for Immigration Arrangements for Non-local Graduates (IANG) to stay in Hong Kong.

Admission Submission

Applicants should provide additional information and some Schools may require to submit portfolio. Only qualified Applicants will be invited to audition and interviews.

CHINESE OPERA (Bachelor and Diploma in Foundations Programmes)

Additional Information

1. Experience and training received in Chinese Opera
2. Other training, qualifications and award
3. Personal statement of the Applicant's application (Word limit: 300 in Chinese or English)

Portfolio (Required)

The Applicant is required to submit a short video of Cantonese opera performance or Chinese music performance. The video should clearly show his/her facial features, and the body movements or instrument. Also, the video should demonstrate his/her performance skills and professional potential.

DANCE (Bachelor and Diploma in Foundations Programmes)

Additional Information

1. Experience/ training received in Dance
2. Performance experience

Portfolio

Upon receiving approval from the School of Dance, non-local Applicants who are unable to attend an audition in person with specific reasons should submit a recently recorded 20-minute digital video for audition. The Applicant should submit document to prove the performer's identity in the video. Also, the video should include a technique class and a solo in his/her chosen major dance study.

DRAMA (Bachelor and Diploma in Foundations Programmes)

Additional Information

1. Training, qualifications and awards received for drama, musical, applied theatre, directing, dramaturgy, etc. or other forms of performing arts (e.g. broadcasting, public speaking, emcee hosting, vocal training, singing, dubbing, dance, martial arts, screenwriting, theatrical creation, or any other skills related to performing arts)
2. Personal statement of the Applicant's application and expectation (Word limit: 300 in Chinese or English)

Portfolio

The Applicant may submit portfolios to support his/her applications and chosen major(s). The portfolio should demonstrate his/her performance skills, professional potential, ability and creativity in drama, musical, applied theatre, directing, dramaturgy, and other performing arts related areas. To elaborate on his/her abilities and experience, the portfolio can include solo performance, performance directed or script written by the Applicant, draft design, proposal, script, performance photos, project management record, teaching plan, or any other materials that can support his/her participation in theatre or performing arts related work.

FILM AND TELEVISION (Bachelor Programme)

Additional Information

1. Personal interests
2. Film and television related training or experience
3. Personal statement (Word limit: 300 in both Chinese and English respectively)
4. Certificates/ Awards received in film and television (if any)

Portfolio (Required)

The Applicant should submit no more than 3 supportive pieces of work and all submitted work must be the original creative work of the Applicant. At least one of the submitted works must be a screen work. For each piece of work, please provide a brief description in both Chinese and English. The maximum length of each short screen work is 5 minutes. He/She must clearly indicate which role(s) he/she performed on each submitted work. Short screen work can be fiction or non-fiction created on video in any form such as animation, montage of still images, music video, documentary, video diary, instructive video, etc.

Other types of acceptable supportive work are: written work, visual art work, still photographic work, audio work such as music or sound creation, etc. For written work, the Applicant may submit creative, factual or instructional writing of any type. Each item should not exceed 1,300 words. For still photographic work, 3 separate photographs will be treated as 1 item. For screen or audio work, he/she may upload to and then submit playback links for popular online sites such as Google, YouTube and Vimeo, etc. (The Applicant must provide passwords for links where necessary).

MUSIC (Bachelor and Diploma in Foundations Programmes)

Additional Information

1. Details of recent examination results in music performance and theory
2. Certificates and awards received in music (if any)
- 3a. Applying for Major in Performance (Instrumental and Vocal Studies)
Details of the repertoire studied in the past 12 months (including composer, title, opus, number, and movement) and list the pieces used in examinations
- 3b. Applying for Major in Composition and Electronic Music
For each of the works to be presented at the audition, provide details (title, instrumentation, duration and performance date), and a brief description (musical ideas, development and structure) of the work

Portfolio (Required)

Applying for Major in Performance (Instrumental and Vocal Studies)

For preliminary audition, the Applicant is required to submit a recently made high quality video recording and documents to prove the performer's identity.

Applying for Major in Composition and Electronic Music

For preliminary audition, the Applicant should submit a portfolio of 4 compositions together with their music scores. Score notation must be legible, and with details of instrumentation and performance instructions. If possible, please include audio-recordings of the works while submitting the application online.

THEATRE AND ENTERTAINMENT ARTS (Bachelor and Diploma in Foundations Programmes)

Additional Information

1. Personal interests and hobbies
2. Personal statement (Word limit: 300 in both Chinese and English respectively)
3. Certificates and awards received in theatre and entertainment arts (if any)

Portfolio (Required)

The Applicant is required to submit the portfolios in PDF format or online portfolio (web link) to support the application. The portfolio should contain selected works that represent the Applicant's creative talents, management and/or technical talents as applicable to the area applied for.

Applying for Specialising in Stage and Event Management

Samples of production files, prompt book, budget, schedule, running lists, photographs or other supporting documents for theatre presentations, community projects or other performing arts for which the Applicant has acted in a Stage or Event Management capacity.


Applying for Majoring in Media Design and Technology and Specialising in Technical Direction

Samples of artwork, models, technical drawings, paper works or renderings, sound recordings, sound effects, music compositions, photos, videos of any productions or projects the Applicant has been involved with.

Applying for Specialising in Costume Technology, Property Making, Scenic Art, and Set and Costume Design

Copies of original works such as sketches, drawings, renderings, paintings, technical drawings, visual diaries, etc; photographs of 3D works such as costumes, props, sculptures, models, etc.

Scholarships

Admissions Scholarship

- Awarded to students with reference to their performance in auditions/ interviews, academic and non-academic performance
- The maximum amount can cover full tuition fees, accommodation, subsistence and airfare
- The Scholarship may be renewed at the School's recommendation, depending on the availability of scholarship quotas and fulfilment of the selection criteria

Scholarships for student application

- Awarded to students with reference to their academic and non-academic performance
- The maximum amount can cover tuition fees and other living expenses for 4 years
- Some scholarships support students participating in overseas activities/ service learning activities

School-nominated Scholarships

- Awarded to students with reference to their academic and non-academic performance
- The scholarship amount is up to HK\$ 100,000

Belt and Road Scholarship

- By student application through indicating interest during interview/ audition
- Awarded to students from Belt and Road countries with strong interest and commitment in the development of Hong Kong
- The amount can cover the full tuition fee, tenable for the normal duration of the programme
- The Scholarship is renewable annually subject to satisfactory academic performance and meeting other renewal criteria
