

ACADEMY HISTORY

學院歷史

The Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts, established by Government Ordinance in 1984, is a leading tertiary institution in performing arts in Asia. It provides professional undergraduate education and practice-based postgraduate studies in Chinese Opera, Dance, Drama, Film and Television, Music and Theatre and Entertainment Arts. Its education philosophy reflects the cultural diversity of Hong Kong with emphasis on Chinese and Western traditions, and interdisciplinary learning.

The Academy awards Bachelor Honours Degrees and Master's Degrees that are accredited by the Hong Kong Council for Accreditation of Academic and Vocational Qualifications.

The site of the main Academy campus located on the Wanchai waterfront was provided by the Hong Kong Government, which meets the annual capital and recurrent costs of the Academy. At the inception of the institution, the Hong Kong Jockey Club donated HK\$300 million to cover the construction costs of the buildings which opened in 1985. Béthanie, the site of the institution's Landmark Heritage Campus in Pokfulam, has housed training facilities for the School of Film and Television since 2007.

香港演藝學院於一九八四年依據香港政府條例成立，是亞洲首屈一指的表演藝術高等學府，提供學士課程與實踐為本的碩士課程，專業範疇包括戲曲、舞蹈、戲劇、電影電視、音樂、舞台及製作藝術。學院的教育方針著重反映香港的多元文化，中西兼容，更提倡跨學科學習。

學院之榮譽學士學位及碩士學位課程，均由香港學術及職業資歷評審局甄審。

演藝學院主校址位於灣仔海旁，由香港政府提供。政府每年資助學院之經費。香港賽馬會則在創校時捐出三億港元興建校舍。校舍於一九八五年啟用。座落於薄扶林的百年歷史建築伯大尼，由二〇〇七年起成為演藝學院古蹟校園及電影電視學院的教室。
